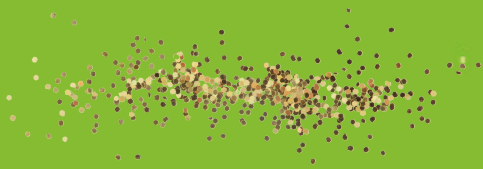


ECO-ALTERNATIVES

GLITTER



Fallen leaves can become natural 'glitter' using a hole punch.

Using your hole punch you can also recycle used, coloured paper into 'glitter' for crafts.

Forage in your school grounds, carefully pick tiny petals to replace glitter in crafts.

Another natural alternative is lentils - they're cheap and come in brown, yellow, green, red and black varieties.

Coloured sand is easy to make using liquid food dye and sand.

Rice can also be dyed using food colouring and vinegar for sensory play.
